

Jewels of the South

March 10-15, 2026



Savannah, GA, has a well-deserved reputation as one of the most enchanting cities of the old south, and, if anything, is more beautiful today than it was in the past. And Charleston, SC, is in that same class. Which is why I've paired up to lead a photo trip there with my old friend (and photography teacher at Nikon School for nearly 30 years), Bill Durrence, who's lived in Savannah his entire life. We'll spend three days exploring both the man-made and natural splendors of that classic old southern city, and one day in Charleston for a taste of it as well.

This is a small group trip, limited to six clients, myself and a second instructor, for eight people, total. We'll use two vehicles, which means everyone will have their own door and plenty of room. The trip starts and ends in Savannah, and we'll



take care of getting you from the airport as well as all local transportation. There will be plenty of walking, sometimes on uneven pavement or trails, as we explore the cities as well as nearby nature areas and the beach. Sunrise at this time of year is around 7:30am and sunset around 7:30pm.



The price is \$2400/person. That includes transportation to and from the Savannah airport, all local travel during our four days of photography, entry fees as well as planning and instruction and critiques (as requested). It does not include flights to/from Savannah, meals, or lodging (although I have reserved a block of rooms for us right in the heart of Savannah, which you'll pay for when you get there). Deposit and final payment details for the trip are at the bottom of this note.

Here's the itinerary (dates are fixed, but what we do at what exact times may shift based on weather or other changing conditions):

Tuesday, March 10, 2026

Plan to arrive at the airport (SAV) by mid-afternoon (no later than 4pm). After getting everyone from the airport, we'll have a welcome

reception at Bill's home before going to dinner together. We'll spend all five nights at one hotel, the Best Western Savannah Historic District (\$201/night plus tax, including breakfast). A block of rooms are already reserved, you don't need to do anything about that.

Wednesday, March 11, 2026

We'll start early with a sunrise shoot along Bluff Drive (Isle of Hope is an exurb of Savannah, taking its name from being an evacuation area during the Yellow Fever epidemic). It's a curving road along the intercoastal waterway/Skidaway River with a marina on one side of the road where the sun will come up, and a variety of beautiful homes on the other. Breakfast nearby. From there we'll come back to downtown Savannah for a walking tour until lunchtime.



In the afternoon we'll visit the Savannah Wildlife Refuge, which is home to many species of birds as well as alligators.



Returning to Savannah in time for sunset, we may see a little more of town before heading over to Plant Riverside for a tour and dinner.

Thursday, March 12, 2026

Another early morning as we drive to Tybee Island for sunrise near the lighthouse. Afterwards we'll have breakfast at a café there, then continue our exploration, visiting the Strand before heading to Fort Pulaski. For lunch we'll stop at a local crab shack, then head to Bonaventure Cemetery. After that we'll return to the hotel for a late-afternoon break (and dinner on your own) before heading out for our night shoot.







Sunday, March 15, 2026

With the trip over, we'll take you back to the Savannah airport for flights home. Don't book any flights before 10am (or if you do, or plan on a much later flight, please make your own travel arrangements to get to the airport). Or, you might want to consider staying a couple of extra days to take part in Savannah's famous St. Patrick's Day parade and celebrations. If you do decide to do that, you'll want to book your hotel room ASAP, as they fill quickly!

Level of difficulty: Moderate. There will be plenty of walking, sometimes on uneven surfaces (cobblestones, trails, boardwalks, sand...).

Weather: Expect a high around 70 in the daytime and down to around 50 overnight. Savannah averages about 3-inches of rain in March, so there's a good chance we'll have some.



Here's how to register and pay:

To register, simply call or email me to confirm that there's a spot available for you. After that, I'll let you know when it's time to send me

your deposit (\$1000) and book travel. The deposit is fully refundable until November 25 in case you have to cancel. After that it's refundable if you or I can find someone to take your spot.

The balance, \$1400, is due January 10, 2024. After that, if you have to cancel, I can refund all your money if either you or I can find someone to take your spot. If you're worried that you might have to cancel, I'd suggest looking into trip insurance.
